Report by Ed on Jackson

- Micky has made a big hit with the Scouts
- Lon and Johnnie are living with the Hubbards who are Methodists
- Lon and Micky will be working together - Lon giving a prophetic message of revolution through a kind of shock treatment and Micky, through her grace, making this message acceptable
- Margie is in Meridian, working with a NCC man for orientation
- Bob Bailey left for Vicksburg on Friday
- Ann Strickland came in Friday.
- Saturday I drove up to see Duncan Grey to clarify our relation to the HRC. Connie Currie had expressed a concern after talking to the base commander who had grossly distorted our appearance there.

The council here should be set up within the next three weeks. It was Dr. Grey's suggestion that in making our contacts we ask them if they are familiar with the state council on human relations and if they are not to give them the name of who to write to and send their name to the HRC.

We should not represent ourselves as working for the HRC.

Ann Strickland will work directly with the council and not so much with COFO.

Howard, John, Lon and Micky will be doing the same sort of work.

Sue will hopefully be working with Mr. Thompson in Jackson on a newsletter.

There was a suggestion that we mimeograph the HRC charter.

Mike has been offered a chance to work in the theatre - this would give him a chance to do both writing and acting.
Howard will continue to be travelling - he may go to Natchez for a week or so.

The picture in Jackson is good - the situation is less frustrating than ours is - there is plenty to do because of contacts already made. Although some initiative is involved, it is a much more structured situation in some ways. I feel that all are doing well.
